Meeting Summary May 19, 2018

Kathleen Marin, President

Christine Morgan opened the meeting at 10 am. We intentionally had no guest speaker to allow for more time for socializing, election of new officers and the silent auction.

Kathleen Marin spoke about traveling with a hearing loss. She stated that what worked best was downloading the airline's app to receive notifications of gate changes, delays, and boarding. The monitors in our airport now display which zone is boarding. It was also helpful to notify the flight attendants of her hearing loss, and they asked how best to communicate with her and always got her attention before talking to her. Kathleen also talked about a very powerful experience at a civil rights museum which provided an opportunity to understand what it was like for people of color in the 1960's trying to earn basic civil rights. She then used that experience to remind us that when we advocate for our rights and needs as people with hearing loss, we are not risking injury, jail or even death as the advocates did 50 years ago. When we need to ask for accommodations or educate people about hearing loss, we can take comfort from the knowledge that we are risking at most a bruise to the ego, thus making it easier to get the courage to go out and advocate.

Lionel Locke talked about the upcoming HLAA Convention in Minneapolis, June 21-24. There are still opportunities to volunteer, including registration, monitoring workshops, bus coordinator for the shuttle to West Side Story, ticket checker for the Mandy Hardy concert, and greeter at the exhibition hall. Please contact Lionel if you would like to volunteer. Registration on site is \$350 for members or \$425 for nonmembers. There are also 1 day passes for \$200 each day. Admittance to just the exhibition hall is free, but that is definitely worth seeing. There is also a tour of the Twin Cities on Sunday.

Marie Saliterman reminded us that membership dues are due in September. She then described her assistive listening device (ALD) that, for the first time in 30 years, allows her to hear everyone in a meeting. That sparked a discussion about ALDs, T-coils, Bluetooth and the need to ask our audiologists to activate our t-coils.

Monique Hammond discussed the importance of looping and asked us to be aware over the summer of where we would like loops, where we would like to hear better. We can then contact her and she will pass this on to LoopMN to see what they can do about it. She also wants us to spread the word about HLAA-TC, as it is the best kept secret about hearing loss in the Twin Cities. That's our homework for the summer.

Lionel then explained the process of electing new officers, that this chapter follows both our bylaws and Roberts Rules of Order. He presented the candidates from the nominating committee and asked if there were any nominations from the floor. There were none. The members voted and the candidates were elected. The new Board is as follows. President: Kathleen Marin. Vice President: Mike Higgins. Secretary: Ross Hammond. Treasurer: Lionel Locke. Immediate Past President: Christine Morgan. Second Past President: Monique Hammond.

The remainder of the meeting was spent on the silent auction, pot luck and socializing. We raised \$226 in the auction. Christine thanked everyone for their participation today, in helping to set up and take down the meetings, and for volunteering at our conference. She reminded people that we have 3 committees that could use members: social media, legislative and membership. She then closed the meeting at noon. We will meet again September 15th.

Kathleen Marin



Kathleen Marin was raised in the Washington, DC area, then attended college at Loyola University in New Orleans, LA. She went on to the Ohio State University for her masters and PhD in psychology. She worked as a therapist in Ohio and Minnesota in a variety of settings, including mental health clinics, a medical clinic, and private practice, as well as providing in-home therapy.

During her career, she worked with children, teens, adults, couples, families and groups and also conducted workshops and taught a course on cross-cultural counseling. She also worked for a few years as a learning disabilities specialist, conducting assessments and providing insight and counseling on how to live well and succeed in educational settings with learning disabilities.

In addition, she speaks Spanish proficiently.


In 2013, Kathleen experienced a sudden sensorineural hearing loss, leaving her severely to profoundly deaf on the left side. She also learned that she had an acoustic neuroma on the right side. Two years later, she had another sudden sensorineural hearing loss, this time on the right side, that caused moderate to severe hearing loss, tonal distortion and significant tinnitus. She now uses a cochlear implant on her left side and a hearing aid on the right.

She has spent the last 2 years as the vice president of HLAA-TC, advocating for people with hearing loss.

In her spare time, she enjoys playing the piano, attending musical concerts, reading, traveling, and hanging out with her friends.

Mike joins the HLAA-TC Board having worked in corporate and government leadership positions throughout his career. He lives in Apple Valley, MN with his wife Patricia and they have three sons and four grandchildren in the Twin cities area. After Patricia “encouraged” him to undergo a hearing exam at the Minnesota State Fair he began to learn much about more about his own hearing loss and was introduced to HLAA-TC by Christine (aka – Tai Chi Instructor). With just a little encouragement, he joined our board to pay it forward.

He has served people in one way or another throughout his work career and volunteering. In 2017, he retired from HealthPartners as a Senior Manager in Administrative Operations Development. Prior to HealthPartners he worked (twice) for and retired from National Car Rental Systems formerly headquartered here in Minneapolis. Between those two assignments, he worked for the State of Minnesota, Department of Administration, Travel Management.

Prior to retiring Mike had volunteered in his spare time as a licensed youth soccer coach for 20 years, a youth hockey coach, an American Red Cross CPR instructor, a PADI SCUBA Divemaster, a PAC adult for confirmation students, a Precepts Upon Precepts instructor, and a member of Kiwanis.

Mike shared - “I believe in the HLAA-TC mission and, through my own experiences, understand that those who have hearing loss need support from others in dealing with that loss. We all need help to get through those challenges we invariably experience. Those who have walked that path are best at providing that help”.



Ross Hammond




Ross Hammond is a consulting professional electrical engineer.
