Summary of HLAA-TC meeting Saturday, May 18, 2024

The May chapter meeting of HLAA-TC was an in-person only meeting at Courage Kenny in Golden Valley, MN (no Zoom attendees). It was an end of the year indoor picnic. Since this was the last meeting of the 2023-2024 season, it was more informal with no presentation. Instead, attendees were encouraged to bring food to share (President Byrdie Coninx furnished Broasted Chicken and others brought salads and baked goods among other things).

President Byrdie Coninx started the meeting by encouraging everyone to introduce themselves. Then we watched a video that was an interview between (past presenter) Shari Eberts and Race Car driver Keenan Tully. The video was from The "This Week In Hearing" YouTube Channel and the video is entitled "Racing Beyond Barriers: Keenan Tully's Journey with Hearing Loss and Motivating Others."

Keenan has hearing loss and has started a podcast called "UnDEAFeated." In the video interview Shari Eberts covered the life, career and hearing loss of Keenan Tully. He was born and raised in England and grew up with considerable hearing loss. There was a period of time when he didn't wear his hearing aids (as a teenager) but finally started to wear them again and immediately could notice the benefits. Keenan now lives in the United States and is a race car driver pursuing NASCAR. The interview was an interesting and inspiring perspective from someone making their way in their career with hearing loss. Keenan speaks about hearing loss to inspire confidence in others living with hearing loss (and pursuing their dreams). You can find a link to the video, along with a transcript:


Upcoming June Book Club



Summary: By age four, Claudia Marseille had hardly uttered a word. When her parents finally had her hearing tested and learned she had a severe hearing loss, they chose to mainstream her, hoping this would offer her the most “normal” childhood possible. With the help of a primitive hearing aid, Claudia worked hard to learn to hear, lipread, and speak even as she tried to hide her disability in order to fit in. As a result, she was often misunderstood, lonely, and isolated—fitting into neither the hearing world nor the Deaf culture.
